Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's Lutheran Church,

Our BIG theme continues, and we're celebrating something BIG during May. On May 19th, we commemorate Pentecost Sunday. The word Pentecost is Greek for 50th day, and it marks 50 days after Easter when we remember the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples while they were in hiding. This day is BIG because it also marks the beginning of the church. Sometimes people refer to Pentecost as the birthday of the Church.

The context for understanding Pentecost is important, and why it is considered the birth of the Church. Jesus had been killed and his followers were terrified for their own lives. They were hiding in a locked room, unsure of what was to come next. Jesus had promised to send the Advocate, telling his disciples before this death, "the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you" (John 14:26). When the Holy Spirit descended upon them in Acts 2, it came with sound, wind, and fire. Peter said to the other disciples, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him" (Acts 2:38-39). The Church was born through these words.

Pentecost is also the longest season of the church calendar, extending all the way to the season of Advent, and emphasizes the Holy Spirit. Much like the disciples were called out of hiding, Pentecost is also a time for us to move into the world. The season of Pentecost reminds us to renew our commitment to God's call, filled with the Holy Spirit, to love our neighbors.

I hope that you'll consider how the Holy Spirit is moving you this month into BIG things. Maybe it's a new job, a new adventure, a new relationship, or a new normal. These new changes might make you nervous. But know that as the Holy Spirit moved through the disciples, it was also a source of comfort. The Holy Spirit not only brought them out of hiding, but they knew the Holy Spirit would remain with them. Whatever BIG that is coming your way this month, God is with you through sound, wind, and fire.

Lastly, one tradition that Lutherans often partake in is wearing the color red on Pentecost Sunday. Red is the color of fire and is often worn during festive celebrations. I invite you to wear red on Pentecost Sunday to symbolize that the Holy Spirit is here among us, moving through us and with us.
