Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's,

As we move into August, the days are starting to feel busy again; harvest time is near, school preparations are underway, and many of us are soaking up the last moments of summer. In this month's newsletter, we continue our focus on the Ten Commandments, and we turn to the Seventh Commandment: "You shall not steal."

Most of us learned early in life that taking something that doesn't belong to you is wrong. Martin Luther writes that we are not only to avoid taking our neighbor's money or property, but we are to help them "improve and protect their property and means of making a living."

In other words, the Seventh Commandment isn't just about what we shouldn't do, but it's about how we live in community. It's about building a culture of fairness, respect, and care for one another's well-being.

In our present day, stealing can show up in more complex ways like unfair wages, housing practices that push people out of neighborhoods, or using someone's work or ideas without credit. It can even be seen in how we treat time, resources, and labor, especially when we diminish the value of someone else's contributions or their dignity and worth.

The commandment asks us to examine our lives more deeply: How do we engage in business, in school, and in our relationships? Are we treating others with honesty? Are we looking out for the most vulnerable in our communities? Do we help our neighbors not just survive, but thrive? As people of faith, we are called to be stewards, and not only of our own resources, but of the collective good.

The Seventh Commandment reminds us that living faithfully means we do more than refrain from harm. We are called to actively pursue good for others. We honor God not only by what we avoid, but by what we choose to do: to give, to protect, to support.

May this season be one where we walk closely with our neighbors, mindful of how we share, protect, and uplift one another. May we continue to be shaped by God's grace and inspired by Christ's example of love and justice.

making known the needs and burdens
your compassion bids us bear,
stirring us to tireless striving,
