Greetings Saint Mark's,

October brings the steady rhythm of God's creation, seasons of change, and the harvest. This month we focus on the Ninth Commandment: Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house.

Martin Luther explained the Ninth Commandment like this: "We should fear and love God so that we do not craftily seek to gain our neighbor's inheritance or home, nor get it by a show of right, but help and serve him in keeping it."

At its core, this commandment invites us to look honestly at our desires and the ways we compare ourselves to others. Instead, God calls us into contentment and trust. We are reminded that true peace is not found in possessions or property, but in knowing that what we have comes from God's generosity.

When we honor this commandment, we also honor our neighbors. We protect what belongs to them, celebrate their joys, and support them in keeping the blessings they have been given. In doing so, we live out a love that reflects God's intention for us and trust in the abundance of God's creation.

As we move through this month, may we learn to see our homes, our families, and our communities as sacred gifts. Let us be people who find joy not in comparison, but in gratitude; not in taking, but in serving; not in envy, but in love.
