Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's Lutheran Church,

In this month's newsletter, I continue sharing more about the Planting Hope campaign from the synod office. The "Planting Hope" campaign expresses our confidence that God is at work in the 110 congregations and mission starts of the synod and God is at work in the East Metro of the Twin Cities, the territory served by the Saint Paul Area Synod. This three-year campaign offers an opportunity to contribute to the collective involvement of 120,000 Lutherans of this synod in four activity areas. The four areas are: Invite neighbors into life in Christ; Renew the congregations of the synod; Raise up the next generations of leaders; and Invest in a transformative project on the East Side of St. Paul with Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota.

When I attend synod events and describe where St. Mark's is located, I often describe the congregation as the synod's most southern congregation. If you are curious, First Evangelical Lutheran Church in Rush City is the most northern. That's about 84 miles north of us. For me, this means two things. One, the synod map covers a long range of congregations, cities, and towns between its most northern and southern congregations. Two, because we are so far south, St. Mark's can often feel disconnected from the larger body of the synod. Despite the geographic distance, however, we have been able to maintain good relationships with the synod office and the other St Paul Area synod congregations, especially congregations within our smaller, geographic conference within the synod. Through the Planting Hope campaign, we have another opportunity to support congregations throughout the synod. This month, I will focus on the second impact area of the campaign: Renew the congregations of the synod

Congregations, large and small, call individual Christians to be church together with others and provide a center for worship, service, learning and shared life in Christ. Every congregation is a mission outpost, discovering ways to revitalize mission and share God's good news in a time of increased secularization and indifference to faith life. Funds raised for this area will provide stewardship and vitality training in 10 congregations per year, and provide financial contributions annually for five years to support the work of current mission starts and intentional redevelopment of congregations.

The measurable impact goal for this activity area is to strengthen five to seven mission starts and ethnic specific congregations, lead two more redevelopment congregations through an intense program of renewal, and to engage 300-400 individuals in 50-60 congregations in the process of congregational vitality and stewardship education.

What an exciting and meaningful opportunity! In addition to sharing in this newsletter, Bishop Patricia Lull will be joining us on Sunday, February 19th. She will share the Gospel message during service and present more about the Planting Hope campaign. We plan to have a potluck, so join us for service, information sharing, and fellowship.
