Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's,

The long and warm days of summer are here. As we continue moving through the Ten Commandments, June brings us to the Fifth: "You shall not murder."

Like many of the commandments, this one seems fairly straightforward, and many of us can't even imagine acting violent towards another person. However, Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism, digs deeper. He reminds us that this commandment isn't just about avoiding physical harm, it's about actively choosing to care for the people around us.

Luther puts it this way: "We are to fear and love God, so that we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbors, but instead help and support them in all of life's needs." In other words, God calls us not just to avoid doing wrong, but to look for ways to do good.

That might mean checking in on a friend who's struggling. It could look like choosing compassion when someone makes a mistake, or staying present when a loved one needs support. It's the choice to be patient in the checkout line or to be kind to a stranger who looks like they're having a hard day.

In our world today, there are so many ways people experience harm, violence, hunger, loneliness, and exclusion. The Fifth Commandment asks us to be part of the healing instead. Living out the Fifth Commandment means standing up for those who are vulnerable, listening with love, and showing up when it would be easier to look away.

This summer, whether you're working, traveling, caring for kids, or just enjoying a quieter pace, there are countless small moments where you can bring life and grace into someone else's day.

May God open our eyes to see those opportunities, and give us the courage to act on them.
