Pastor's Message

Dear Friends,

As September arrives, our lives begin to shift once again. School doors reopen, routines return, and the energy of fall is here. In this month's newsletter, we study the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."

Martin Luther explained the commandment like this: We should fear and love God, so that we do not lie about, betray or slander our neighbor, but excuse him, speak well of him, and put the best construction on everything.

Luther reminds us that this commandment is not only about avoiding lies, it is about protecting our neighbor's good name. Words have tremendous power. They can build up or tear down, bring healing or cause deep harm. St. Paul writes, "Therefore, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another" (Ephesians 4:25).

In today's world, information spreads faster than ever through conversations, social media, 24-hour news, and even casual remarks. So, this commandment feels incredibly relevant. Reputations can be damaged by half-truths, assumptions, or words that are spoken without much thought. Sometimes we fail to speak out when someone is unfairly criticized, or we let gossip pass without challenging it.

To live faithfully under the Eighth Commandment is to become people of truth and grace. It means practicing restraint before speaking, choosing words that protect rather than wound, and striving to see our neighbors in the best possible light. It means asking ourselves: *Am I helping build trust and understanding, or am I adding to division and harm?*

This commandment also challenges us in how we talk about those with whom we disagree. In a time when public conversations can be so polarized, Luther invites us into a different way: a way of charity, patience, and careful listening. To live out this commandment is to resist the easy path of criticism and instead look for the image of God in each person.

As we enter the season of fall together, may we commit ourselves to being people whose words reflect God's love and truth. May we be known as a congregation that not only avoids gossip and falsehood, but one that actively builds up our neighbors, defends the vulnerable, and speaks in ways that bring life.
