### **Pastor's Message**

Happy New Year!

Last month, I wrote about looking back at the year and trying to start or complete those unfinished projects or new year resolutions we had made on January 1, 2022. I wrote that it was *not* too late to renew the promises we made to ourselves or to others. We often look at the start of the new year as a reset, a fresh start, or an opportunity to recommit ourselves. And I don't want to discourage that sense of renewal because for many, the start of a new year does signify change or a clean break that many desperately need and want. Instead, I want to remind you that not only is it *not* too late, but it's **never** too late.

For God, change and transition is always welcomed. We can simply look at some of our favorite Biblical stories. From Abram to Abraham. Bread into wine. Zacchaeus the tax collector to Zacchaeus the giver. Saul to Paul. Death to resurrection.

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Change is always welcomed because we, as human beings, are imperfect, and God knows this. As Lutherans, we believe that through God's grace alone, we are saved. And in that saving, we are given a new life in Christ. It is in this new life, this new creation that we can live out God's grace. So, if the start of a new year marks a new beginning, a sense of renewal, or the opportunity to try something differently and new for you, then I encourage you to let it be connected to how to live out God's grace to yourself and others.

And as much as we talk about change, the Apostle Paul writes, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).
