Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's Lutheran Church,

If you read my section in last month's newsletter, you know I'm trying a new approach to this year's newsletter. I'm going to focus on this theme of "BIG," and how we can continue to be **A Small Church with a Big Heart** this year.

The Lenten season is among us, and you probably know it's a BIG deal in our faith. Lent is the forty-day season (excluding Sundays) of penitence and preparation for the Three Days of Holy Week and Easter, which is another BIG deal in our faith. In other words, the month of March is a busy time in the life of the church.

For this year's Wednesday Lenten services, we are using a liturgical study from ELCA World Hunger, which is a ministry of the ELCA, working with and through ELCA congregations to end hunger and poverty. This liturgical study invites us to follow Jesus into the wilderness and to consider the "wild places" of the world, where we encounter human need, abuse of power, risk and God's grace. Each Wednesday service, we focus on themes found in Luke 4:1-21, and as we journey through the BIG wildness, we are asked to reflect on baptism, hunger, power, faith and the good news Jesus proclaims to the poor, the oppressed and the captive (Luke 4:18).

This year's Lenten theme reminds us that there are BIG ways the world is in need. Not only are we spiritually hungry for a loving God, but the physical realities of hunger and poverty surround us. Sometimes those physical realities are quite visible, and most times, those realities are more hidden. Maybe it is trying to stretch those dollars and cents until the next paycheck, stopping at the food shelf because there were more important bills to take care of this month, or avoiding those dreaded phone calls from the debt collector. These are the realities that we and our neighbors quietly face that keep us up at night.


And just when we think no one is paying attention to the BIG problems in our lives, God is there. God is there in the food shelf volunteer, helping us load up our car. God is there in the neighbor, sharing a meal. God is there in our silent prayers, even if that prayer is two words: Please, God.

The Lenten season and Easter show us two extremes—the wilderness where Jesus is tempted and the resurrection of Jesus from death. Through both, we see God's BIG love, faithfulness, and presence in all of it. Just as God was there for Jesus, God is here for us.

I hope you will be able to journey with us through Lent and join us for our Easter celebration.
