### Pastor's Message

Dear St. Mark's Lutheran,

As the days grow shorter and the air turns colder, we enter a season of gratitude and reflection. November brings with it Thanksgiving, which is often a time to count our blessings and give thanks for all that God has provided. It's also fitting that this month we focus on the Tenth Commandment: You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

To covet is to long for what belongs to someone else, which can lead to discontent when we measure our worth against what others have. In a world that constantly tells us we need more to be happy, this commandment calls us back to a deeper truth: contentment and gratitude are signs of a faithful heart.

Martin Luther's explanation helps us see that this commandment is not only about property or possessions. It's also about relationships, work, and trust. We are not to "entice, force, or steal away" what rightfully belongs to others, but rather to honor and support our neighbors so that they may keep what God has entrusted to them.

The Tenth Commandment isn't meant to shame us for wanting more. It's meant to free us from the endless cycle of comparison so that we can find joy in God's abundance. When we are content, envy changes to gratitude, and gratitude into generosity.

As we gather for Thanksgiving later this month, I invite you to take time to reflect on the blessings in your life. What gifts, seen and unseen, has God placed before you? Who are the people who enrich your life? How can you use your blessings to bring joy to others?

May we learn to rejoice not only in our own blessings but also in the blessings of others. May we see in every good gift, whether it's friendship, work, or simple daily bread, the loving and abundant God who gives us all we need.


